CIEH developing contribution to the Olympics / Paralympics 2012

To put the Olympics into perspective (27/08 -9/09/12)

- 7.7 m tickets Olympics (1.5 m Paralympic), 15,000 athletes from 205 countries (26 sports and 300 events)
- Main Olympic venues, training camps and Olympiad cultural events
- Upwards of 15 million meals provided within venues, over 9 million for the general public
- High quantities of high risk food in Sydney, 450 tonnes of poultry, 280 tonnes of seafood
- In Sydney 115 officers carried out 6,278 inspections
- 7.5 tonnes of food were destroyed due to food safety risks

- Work with HPA and NHS to develop public health plan
- Work to ensure broader environmental health themes are addressed
- Develop training solutions for building capacity and capability in both business and EH profession



What are we aiming to do next (2)?

- Facilitate discussions on capacity to manage food safety
- Set up an update event for EH services with partners
- Set up a series of meetings for EH services in venues outside of London
