9,000,000 tickets


14,000,000 meals

160,000 workers



Olympics in perspective

- Over 9m tickets 15,000 athletes from 205 countries (26 sports and 300 events)
- Main Olympic venues, training camps and Olympiad cultural events
- 160,000 workforce and 70,000 volunteers
- Upwards of 14 million meals provided within venues
- High quantities of high risk food
- 82 tonnes of seafood, 100 tonnes of meat, 330 tonnes of fruit and vegetables

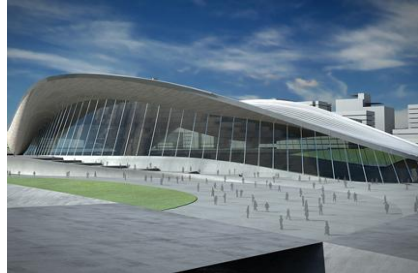
