



## CIEH Leading Innovation Award Criteria 2026

This category recognises an individual, team or organisation that has delivered a novel, evidence-led solution to a clearly defined environmental health challenge, achieving measurable benefits for people and/or the environment. It is intended for practical innovations (tools, processes, policies, services or partnerships) that others in the profession could adapt or adopt.

### Who should enter

- Open to individuals, teams, partnerships and organisations worldwide working in any environmental health discipline (e.g., food safety, environmental protection, housing, health protection, occupational health, port health).
- Entries may be self-nominated or nominated by others. The nominator must be a CIEH member and, for team/organisation entries, at least one team member should be a CIEH member (to align with other 2026 categories).
- Previous winners may enter with a different project or demonstrably new phase of work.

### Eligibility period

Work must have been active between 1 January 2025 and 10 May 2026. Projects need not have concluded, but judges will place particular emphasis on progress to date and the quality of evaluation.

### What to submit

1. Overarching summary (max 100 words). Provide a concise overview of the innovation, who it serves and the value it delivers. This may be used in shortlisting and event materials.
2. Entry narrative (**up to 800 words**) covering: context and problem definition; objectives; the innovative solution (what's new and why it matters); strategy and delivery; collaboration and stakeholder engagement; measurement and evaluation; outcomes and community impact; lessons learned and next steps.

3. Supporting evidence (max four attachments; total size up to 16MB). Examples: data charts or dashboards, independent testimonials, photos, short videos, case studies, protocols or code repositories. If larger files are essential, provide a link or submit via a secure file-transfer service and label clearly with your entry name.

### How entries will be judged

- **Innovation & originality:** Demonstrates a clear departure from standard practice and a strong fit to the stated problem; creativity is purposeful and evidence-informed.
- **Relevance & problem definition:** Defines the need, Shows material, evidenced benefits for people, teams and/or communities and the environment.
- affected populations and context; shows understanding of constraints and risks.
- **Evidence, measurement & evaluation:** Uses appropriate data and methods to track outputs, outcomes and learning; includes independent feedback where possible.
- **Value for money** Delivers strong outcomes relative to resources invested; demonstrates efficiency and prudent use of funds.
